Year in Review

January: 7 Honor/Memory trees had been planted in the Arboretum in 2019 & 2020.

February: Chesapeake Bay Foundation offered the WCV Nature Trail & Arboretum free seedlings and other young plants.

March: 27 residents planted over 200 plants in Arboretum & along Trail. 4 new Honor/Memory trees were planted

April: Jerry Lawrence was nominated by MHC for the Volunteer of the Year Award. Trail crew has new 35-gallon water tank.

May: 110 attend the Arboretum dedication. A new Memory Tree & 3 rhododendrons were planted. Trail crew has new lawn mower.

June: Flower Factory resumes supplying flowers to WCV Market Place to benefit Benevolent Care fund and to decorate the common areas at Woodcrest.

July: Trail Crew, Arboretum, and Flower Factory participate in Activities Fair. Trail crew continues checking trail for poison plants.

August: Trail crew repairs trail after tropical storm Fred brought heavy rains. Swarr Run had minor flooding.

September: Picnic table added to Arboretum. Dennis resigns as Secretary/Treasurer. David Suh becomes new Treasurer.

October: Bruce Metzler assumes role of Secretary. A new experimental wild flower area is prepared.

November: Planted 7 new Honor/Memory Trees. A second new wild flower garden bed is prepared.

December: 12 new Honor/Memory trees were planted in 2021 bringing the total to 19 trees.
