## Little Conestoga Blue/Green Corridor & Woodcrest Villa



Recent news accounts revealed that the Little Conestoga Creek on Woodcrest Villa's southeastern border and the adjoining wetlands could be the focus of a major restoration effort in 2 or 3

years. The area has several feet of silt that has built up from erosion upstream in past centuries. The creek now just occupies a narrow channel surrounded by this silt. The project will remove the silt so that in times when there is heavy runoff, the creek can occupy the area that was filled in with silt and not cause flooding and not pollute the Chesapeake Bay. The project will also remove invasive plants that have taken

over and replace them with native plants that will attract birds and butterflies. Part of the plan to is build a public walking trail along the Little Conestoga.

Notice that Swarr Run flows into the Little Conestoga Creek on the east end of the project. Only that tiny section of Swarr Run is in the project. Hence, the work of the Arboretum and Trail Committee to establish a riparian barrier along Swarr Run on Woodcrest's northern border is even more important. Recently the committee reviewed this area with Ryan Davis from the Alliance for the

Chesapeake Bay. He has recommended that we participate in the Keystone 100 Million Trees initiative to obtain plants for our riparian barrier.
